Medication for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD / MAT)

- Buprenorphine (Subutex / Suboxone)
- ER-Buprenorphine Injectables (Sublocade / Brixadi)
- Methadone
- ER-Naltrexone Injectable (Vivitrol)

MOUD Outcomes

Review of 18 clinical trials in jail & prison settings

MOUD during incarceration (started pre-release)

- Increased community follow-up
- Reduced illicit opioid use after release
- Reduced IV drug use

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Overdose reduction

Rhode Island Department of Corrections

12% statewide reduction in fatal OD

New York City Jails

Reduced post-release fatal overdose by 80%

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Justice and Safety

Comparison of 2 neighboring Massachusetts Jails

Jail with Buprenorphine program:

- Reduced reincarceration (21% vs 39%)
- Reduce re-arraignment (36% vs 47%)
