

## Basics of EOCCO, OHA, CAC

These four points guide all of our work:

- **1.** Better Health
- 2. Better Care
- **3.** Lower Costs
- **4.** Access to care for all members

The Oregon Health Authority assigns many people to a CCO. Your CCO is the Eastern Oregon Coordinated Care Organization. EOCCO is a network that works on:

- Whole person care based on each member's needs
- Connections to all kinds of services for the member
- Stopping illness before it starts
- Early help to stop the illness from getting worse
- Long-term help with an illness
- Changing access or breaking barriers so that every member can get the help they need
- Helping to spot and end wasteful practices

## Community Advisory Council:

- Meets regularly to ensure the CCO is working on the needs of the members and the community
- Have OHP members from each county served
- Have a county employee from each county served
- Have tribal members from tribes in the region

## **Community Advisory Council Duties:**

- Identify and advocate for preventive care practices to be used by the CCO
- Oversee the Community Health Assessment (CHA)
- Adopt a Community Health Plan (CHP) to serve as a plan to address health disparities and meet health needs of communities
- Review and approve a CHP report yearly
