



CAC Member Role

CAC member will

- Attend meetings & ask questions
 - Talk about issues or needs of OHP members in your community
- Consider information carefully to see if changes are needed
 - Look at data
 - Help choose issues to work on
 - Look at materials to see if changes are needed
- Increase CAC engagement with community members
 - Share with friends and family your role in the CAC
 - Ask friends and family to come to the meetings to share their concerns
 - Assist with creating and reviewing the Community Health Plan (CHP)
- Learn about ways to help your community to be healthy
 - Look at different programs that are “best practices” for creating better health
 - Ask other OHP members what is needed to improve their health
 - Help with the process of creating the Community Health Plan

CAC member expectations

- Attend 1 meeting per quarter for 2 hours
- Take time to look at the handouts before the meeting
- Handouts will be given to you in time for the meeting, by mail or email
- Vote in-person, or by email as needed
- CAC members can attend as long as you like. However, you may not be a voting member if your OHP status changes.
