

Community Advisory Council Members

EOCCO:

EOCCO works to ensure Oregon Health Plan members living in Eastern Oregon have access to affordable, high-quality care. This access to care will help members have better health and wellness.

EOCCO serves 12 Eastern Oregon counties: Baker, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Lake, Malheur, Morrow, Sherman, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, and Wheeler.

OHA:

OHA guides and reviews all CCOs in Oregon. OHA contracts for services with EOCCO every 5 years. OHA ensures that the conditions of the contract are met. OHA requires each CCO to have a Community Advisory Council (CAC) to focus on the health needs of the region.

EOCCO CAC:

The EOCCO CAC focuses on the health needs of the region. Each member may share their ideas with the group and make important decisions for the region. The EOCCO CAC will:

- Meet every 3 months
- Help EOCCO address the needs of members
- Have 51% OHP members
- Have county members from each county served
- Have tribal members from tribal nations in the EOCCO service area
- Represent the make-up of the region
- Share ideas for missing or new preventive care practices
- Review and approve funds to be awarded (CBIR and SHARE)
- Assist with the Community Health Assessment process
- Review and adopt a Community Health Plan to address equity issues and meet the health needs of members
- Review and approve a yearly progress report
