(verify with Jill); New Directions Baker County Care Coordination funded for 50K, Baker County Health Dept. 7500 for immunizations (ask Jill which ones). Those that are funded might need support from LCAC. 3. GOBHI changes: Leaders have decided Youth and Family funding grants are no longer funded – March 15 is deadline for reporting, then ended. Linda Watson coordinator can address any questions. 4. Incentive Measures: Update. Middle of Feb. 2019 incentive measures: Need to meet 13 out of 18, to get funding for 20/21.
