Welcome and Introduction Minutes

Discussion	Member and Public Comment
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Darrin Umbarger (Clearview)- Client with MS can't wear a mask due to breathing issues, was turned away from medical care for not wearing a mask. ❖ Darrin Umbarger (Clearview)- Driver for Clearview has within 30 days lost all of his mental abilities. Driver has driven through fields to pick up a client instead of using the roadway and it seems really hard to get him any help/assistance. Several suggestions were made in the chat and a couple of LCAC members provided their information to Darrin for follow-up.
Discussion	Round Table- Janet McFarlane
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Catie Brenaman (UMCHS)- They are seeing an uptick in co-vid cases. They've had to shut down two classes (3 positives in one room and 2 positives in another room). They have hired an RN to facilitate supporting co-vid efforts and to assist with getting the correct vaccine information out to their clientele. ❖ Janet McFarlane (St. Anthony)- stated that they've provided 52 J&J vaccines, however, they've paused since this last Monday due to the issues with this vaccine. She has noticed that more people are coming in with reservations about the vaccines. It has been a completely different feel since the J&J issues came up.
Discussion	MODA Update- Kali Paine
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Kali Paine (MODA)- Training is available. Kali will send flyers to Tiffany for distribution. Boost Oregon Community Workshop will be held in April. 2 in English, 1 Spanish. ❖ Watch for information on the UniteUs Information Exchange Tool that will be coming out. Troy added that it is a great way for clinics to connect to local resources. ❖ Incentive Measures for 2020 were shared. There is still some billing that is occurring that may help the numbers. Kali is planning on sharing the 2021 Metrics on a quarterly basis throughout this next year.

Discussion	CBIR Updates- Catie Brenaman
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Catie Brenaman (UMCHS)- Reviewed all CBIR programs. Jim Setzer will no longer be serving as the Metrics Coordinator. It is an important role as it helps to meet metrics. UmCo LCAC will need to look at how to fill this role.
Discussion	Accounting for LCAC and CBIR- Troy Soenen
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Catie Brenaman (UMCHS)- New grant cycle has started. It has been difficult to come up with the numbers for the actual carryover. It is believed that there is \$36,000 in carryover funds. Catie believes that there is one more payment for GSH that will be paid out. Catie states that there will be better monthly reporting to the group due to updated software and staffing changes. ❖ Troy Soenen (EOCCO/GOBHI)- suggested using the rollover funds for Fruits And Veggies For Families (FAVFF). Troy stated that there was an accounting error in 2018 resulting in @\$16,000 check being issued to the Umatilla County LCAC. Marci suggested utilizing these funds to pay for the oversight of the Administrative Funds for 2021.
Discussion	Community Health Plan Discussion- Troy Soenen
Slides PDF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Troy Soenen (EOCCO/GOBHI) shared the Community Health Plan for 2021. As an LCAC we need to look at the plan on a regular basis to see how we are doing on meeting our goals/activities. Also to review if there are any barriers to the progress and if so, how to mitigate them. Will need to have a motion to approve CHP in May. ❖ Troy shared about the Link for the Comprehensive Behavioral Health survey that will be coming out. It is for community organizations/partnering agencies to complete. Input from members and providers will be gathered in a different manner.

Handout	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Janet McFarlane (St. Anthony)- shared the handout listing the sub-groups and who has signed up to this point. We expect more people to sign up. If you know anyone who would like to be involved, please reach out to Janet. ❖ Meetings will be held at least twice per year. Please let everyone know when the meetings are held so that attendance can be encouraged. This is a great opportunity to learn what is happening in our communities with our OHP members and a great way to engage them in the LCAC.
Discussion	Community Partner Updates- ALL
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Kristen Owen (Lifeways)- Effort to return to face-to-face (in person) meetings as of May 3, 2021. The clinicians will have limited time. Case Managers, Peers, and Treatment is still occurring in community settings. ❖ Sandra Hernandez (Dulas Latina)- looking for partnership support for their Diabetes Prevention Program that they are holding in Spanish in the Milton-Freewater area. They would like referrals from clinics, hospitals, and the health departments. It was suggested that Alisha Lundgren at UmCo Health Department would be a great connection as well as Rebecca Garner in Milton-Freewater. Jessica Marcum asked about translation services for Mam and Kiche. Suggestions were given from several LCAC members. ❖ Julie Smith (Pendleton School District)- K-12 is back to in person schooling. K-5 are attending full day. 6-8 are attending ½ days. The children are needing to re-learn how to sit

	<p>still and learn as attention span has waned. The emotional impact is becoming evident along with the startling abuse and neglect situations that the teachers are seeing.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Erin Bartsch (Blue Mountain Early Learning)- Family voice listening sessions are being held once again on Tuesdays at 6pm. Spanish interpretation is available. They are working to create videos on how to access early learning. They would like some people who can speak Spanish, Mam, and Kiche to help with the acting portion of the videos- please contact Erin if you know someone. Would like to have completed by mid-May. ❖ Jessica Marcum (Community Paramedic Program)- They are working with EOCCO to figure out a more permanent funding stream for them through the Fire Department. EOCCO may contract for members or some other possibility. ❖ Jodi Bissonette (Advantage Dental)- Hermiston opted out of dental, hearing, and vision screenings for children this year. In Morrow County, they are seeing more children with urgent dental needs. Pre co-vid they would have around 5 children with urgent dental needs, this year already they've had 15-20 children with urgent needs. The Care Team has been awesome to work with to help these children get their needs met. ❖ Maria-Ximena Williams (OSU SNAP Ed Coordinator)- Grow This! Challenge has had 45 people sign up. They have mailed the seeds out. They have several schools also participating in the challenge.
