## THW support for IET patients



How Community Health Workers (CHWs), Peer Support Specialists (PSSs) and Peer Wellness Specialists (PWSs) can support the Initiation and Engagement of Substance Use Disorder Treatment (IET) incentive measure.

**Background information:** IET measures the rate of patients ages 18 years and older with an episode of substance use disorder (SUD) who initiate treatment within 14 days of the episode and engage in ongoing SUD treatment within 34 days of initiating treatment. When a patient receives a SUD diagnosis, prompt coordination of care and treatment are vital. Certain THWs can bill the following codes to satisfy both the Initiation and Engagement phases of the IET measure. Completing *one* encounter from the table below within 14 days of a patient's SUD episode date will satisfy the Initiation phase. Completing two encounters within 34 days of the patient's Initiation date will satisfy the Engagement phase.

- CHWs should bill for most services in 30-minute units. A CHW is limited to billing four (4) units per 24-hours per patient, with a maximum of eight (8) units per calendar month per patient. Please refer to EOCCO's <u>THW Billing Guide</u> for complete requirements surrounding billing for THWs.

- Billed visits must include a qualifying diagnosis code from the Alcohol Abuse and Dependence, Opioid Abuse and Dependence, or Other Drug Abuse and Dependence value sets.
