DISCUSSION	Identified Gaps & Recommended Preventative Health Care Practices
<p>Kristen: Concerns regarding access to services like Lifeways. Lifeways is currently 1 month out on psych services. Lifeways in particular is being creative with recruitment to increase work force development.</p> <p>Kathryn: Housing and temporary shelter is a concern for patients who are awaiting for inpatient care. Acute patient will be held in the ER up to days awaiting services and placement. Jails are also being utilized as a place holder for inmates who are also awaiting services.</p> <p>Darren: clients utilize drivers as counselors because it is a safe space.</p> <p>Troy: Acknowledged that these are all tough situations and can be frustrating. GOBHI is currently working with Lifeways on mental health services.</p> <p>Brynna: Advantage Dental is piloting tele-dentistry (not yet in Umatilla County).</p> <p>Catie: Community Health Workers have had success in Umatilla County with helping patient access other services beside the ED.</p> <p>Kacey: concerns with the older/elderly population using meth in place of opioids use.</p> <p>Cathy: concern with promotion of vaping in place of cigarette use</p> <p>Tiffany: stress is the number one reason for vaping, cigarette, and marijuana use</p>	

DISCUSSION	Community Health Improvement Work
<p>Community Health Improvement Plan update: Priority area identified: obesity, chronic disease prevention, behavioral health, violence and safety, access to services, and healthy equity/social determinants of health. Catie reviewed goals of each priority area. Efforts around HPV will be added to the action plan on chronic disease prevention. Jamie will send updated dated in regards to disease and prevention. Parameters will be added around behavioral health term. Goal will be adjusted under access to services to align more with Metrics Health equity alliance will be added to the social determinants of health piece.</p>
