



2019-2020 Community Health Plan (CHP) Grant County Community Advisory Council (LCAC)

Priority Issue:

Wellness Promotion and Prevention

- Health and support across the lifespan (prenatal through aging population)
 - Adolescent physical, mental and oral health
 - Increase community education and awareness of health (mental health, oral health, and access to care).
 - Create community awareness of Social Determinates of Health (SDH)
 - Continued collaboration between community partners, hospitals, public health, behavioral health, oral health and/or primary care to increase and reduce barriers to access, coordinate care, integrate new services or workflows
 - Promotion of trauma informed care policies/practices
- Workforce development

Problem to be solved:

Reduce the negative impacts of Social Determinants of Health in our communities.

Measurement: The LCAC will review county metrics improvement when the EOCCO incentive progress reports are available. When the opportunity arises, the group will support community activities, trainings and events and will track and document total population engagement along with relevant community data.

Goals:

- **Community Health Improvement** - LCAC members will collaborate with community partners, health providers, early learning providers, service agencies, educators, and local business owners to increase community health awareness, to improve SDH, and to promote the value of prevention education and screenings for all ages.
- **Incentive Metrics Improvement** - LCAC members will support the work of care coordination provided by ***Healthcare Providers*** as they work with EOCCO/OHP members

to utilize primary care preventative screenings and health services as outlined in the incentive measures.

- **EOCCO Member Engagement** - LCAC will invite and encourage EOCCO member participation and involvement in community health improvement.

Objectives:

Metrics improvement and coordination of care

The LCAC will continue to support collaborative efforts between community partners, hospitals, public health, behavioral health, oral health and/or primary care to reduce barriers to access, coordinated care, integrate new services or workflows

Community Health Improvement

- Behavioral Health – will continue to support educational opportunities for our communities.
- LCAC will support community education and trainings related to SDH.
- LCAC will support Oral Health projects that increase access to preventative services by supporting and collaborating with community partners.
- LCAC will collaborate with Eastern Oregon Healthy Living Alliance (EOHLA) to support prevention projects.

CAC Supported Community Health Activities/Community Resources:

LCAC Community Health Improvement Partner Support

- Blue Mountain Hospital District – support innovative health promotion and prevention projects within Grant County.
- Cigarette Smoking prevalence –projects to reduce tobacco use/Transformation Grant project, Len’s Drug, Grant County Health Department, local health providers, Advantage Dental and service agencies.
- Mental Health First Aid/Youth & Adult – reduce risk of suicide, mental health stigma. Support trainings for educators, elderly, community partners and community members/by partnering with MHFA certified instructors, ESD, CCS, school staff, health care providers and community members.
- Poverty education trainings, motivational interviewing, trauma informed care trainings/early learning providers, health care providers, Advantage Dental and health care providers
- Oral health promotion to reduce stigma and encourage prevention screenings – Advantage Dental, EOHLA, SBHC, Grant County Health Department, health care providers and educators.

- Families First Parent Resource Center - provides parenting education and supports. Encourages early prenatal care, discourages use of the ER for routine care, conducts developmental screens on all children enrolled in programs and promotes well child visits. Holds annual Family Fun Day community event and hosts an annual Community Screen Day (ASQs).
- Frontier Early Learning Hub - provides incentive funds and staffing for the Community Screen Day. Works with community partners to provide training, materials and support for early childhood education and literacy to ensure that children are ready to learn when they reach kindergarten. Programs encourage well child visits.
- Teen Health Fair - engages all Grant County students, 7th - 12th grades, in health and safety prevention education/Grant County Health Department, SBHC, CCS, service agencies, Blue Mountain Hospital, LCAC, Advantage Dental and a number of community partners.
- Healthy and Fit Kid's Camp - promotes prevention and wellness education to all county 1st and 2nd graders, blended kindergarten and third graders/Blue Mountain Hospital, and a number of community partners and businesses.
- Grant County Family Health Fair – Targets individuals and families who would not otherwise seek health services and engages county residents in health prevention education, prevention screenings, wellness promotion, community health services/BMHD, GCHD, Advantage Dental, Forest Service, public health, state health agencies, health care providers and numerous community partners.
- The Grant County Senior Citizen Advisory Council.
- Community Health Improvement Coalition efforts to address health disparities to improve community health and wellness.
- Community Health Workers supported to improve county EOCCO benchmarks and care coordination
