1. Welcome and Introductions: Haley Hueckman

- Haley opened the meeting and round table introduction were made along with partner updates:
 - Haley Hueckman - mentioned the upcoming Jim Halligan Presentation at South Baker School on 5-16-18 and again at Baker High School Auditorium on 5-17-18.
 - Eric Griffith-NEON has received Opioid funding and is hiring a Community Health Worker for at risk populations; this is a full-time position based out of La Grande. Please contact NEON for more information.
 - Mary Jo Carpenter-Community Connections Fundraiser brought in \$2,400 to raise money for their Nutrition Program.

2. Health Fair – May 5th:

- The E2E catalogs were passed around for everyone to look at (great job!). The catalogs will be coming out every 3 months, the next time will be in August.
- Aubrey Henshaw will have a vehicle to pick up consumers if they would like to attend the health fair on Saturday, May 5th.
- Torie Andrews was hired to coordinate during the event. If you have questions, please contact her.
- There will be 18 raffle prizes to be given away; Torie Andrews will be in charge of distributing the prizes. E2E will have a basket to give away at the fair also.
- The smoke-alizer was not purchased at this time, but will be at a later date so that it can be used at future events.
- The swag bags, pens and stamps have been purchased. The pens and stamps will be at each table. The stamps will be used to stamp the passports and the passports are used to enter into the raffle.
- The medical tables will need to keep track of the number of adolescent wellness visits and colon cancer screening appointments they schedule.
- Meal tickets will be provided to each participating community partner.
- Attendees will receive their meal tickets and passport at the sign up table.

3. Community Health Assessment

- The CCO has to complete a Community Health Assessment every 5 years and the hospital needs to complete one every 3 years.

- Focus Groups will be taking place in Baker City and in Halfway; ten people are needed in each city. The meeting will take approximately 90 minutes. \$25 gift cards will be given to people who participate.
- Discussed who to reach out to in Halfway: Pine-Eagle Clinic, School District via Cammie DeCastro or Carol May.

4. Tobacco Cessation Update

- Community Health Worker Training May 29-30 CEU's available for Community Health Workers
- Jill gave an update on the Tobacco Treatment Specialist (TTS) training.
 - It was originally discussed to offer this as a local training and bring the experts to the area. Upon further review it is not cost effective and the plan is now to have representatives from local agencies travel back east to complete the training.
 - Two people from the following agencies: St. Luke's, St. Alphonsus and New Directions that are involved in direct patient care will travel to Massachusetts.
 - They will need to complete 12 hours of on-line education prior to training on September 24-27, 2018.
