Old Business: Veggie RX Update	
DISCUSSION	<p>Marci McMurphy, GOBHI, very excited about the project and is doing a lot of coordinating. Working on the Policy and Procedure Manual. They attended the Veggie Rx Summit, and was very helpful to them. Have met with Gorge Grown and gotten a lot of good ideas and a tool kit to use. Are now in the process of figuring out a date for the first Advisory Council Meeting. We needed one more person maybe on the Advisory Council, but Cindy Brown is</p>

	<p>from Sherman County, so she may be filling that role. Diane has finished the Policy and Procedure Manual. They will be able to come to the Advisory Council with something to look at, to move forward with, and so it will not hurt their feelings to make changes to it, it was just to work from. Also are working on the Vouchers, how to track, how to tie to the individual client, etc. Met with the data team, and they suggested a QR code. When the vouchers come back they can scan them, and drill down a lot of information that way. The other thing about the vouchers is they are looking for an easy way for the prescribers to get this done easily. Maybe a written thing that they do ahead of time, to be able to use the prescribers time wisely. Teri has a few comments about how to do this. People need to be asked each time with the same questions, and we don't want to lose the integrity of the program. We need to do this every time. People's situations may change. We have to continue to use this as an evidenced based program, and two questions should not be a burden. There is national Data that show the more people were on SNAP, the more that they spent less on health care. Neil Friedrich wants to make sure that we are connecting with Nadja to coordinate with DHS to ensure that we are able to help with prescribing to people when they are doing SNAP intakes. There are two questions to qualify, that are not income related, and there is no proving it. We are hoping that we can address the issues of fraud and other things with the QR code. We need to think about messaging and how to reach out to people. Just a reminder to this group that Teddy and Jennifer are on the Advisory Committee to represent Gilliam County. There are two from Harney and Two from Sherman County as well. We are getting this going and hoping to get it rolled out soon.</p>
<p>New Business: Public Health Modernization</p>	
<p>DISCUSSION</p>	<p>Columbia Gorge CCO and EOCCO with GOBHI as a partner. All but two are on board and two did not sign a letter of support. Wallowa County is in the process of delegating their Health Department back to the state and Wheeler County was too late to come in. NCPHD will be the fiscal agent/ lead agency. Carrie Brighotti will be the chair of the steering committee from Union County, and this will be the body that really speaks for how modernization will work in the region. So what does that mean for the counties that did not get in, Wheeler Co. will still be eligible for resources and Wallowa is taking a big step backwards, not sure why, because they won't be able to receive and Nurse Home Visiting dollars or any Tobacco prevention Funds. If you delegate back they will receive \$0 funding. They felt that it was costing them too much money. So if they decide to do a collaboration with other counties, they will still have to put some funds into it. What they are going to do with the project is to increase public health communicable disease capacity across the entire Eastern Oregon Region. Staff Just started, they include a data analyst who will lead the project; a communicable disease investigator who's going to add capacity to the region around outbreak investigation and general investigation; and a communications outreach and liaison staff who will lead our Health Equity Assessment.</p>
	<p>There was just a general discussion about whether or not there were any consumer topics or issues that we need to know about. The Consumers stated that they didn't think that they had anything at this time for discussion.</p>
