Ken Taylor called meeting to order 12:05pm

Tilli- The team lead for the **Access and Preventive Health Implementation Team** Meetings for the Blue Mountain Hospital. Presenting team findings and updates developed since the hospital's conducted their Community Needs Assessment (CHA).

Three Main Goals-

Access to Care

Goal 1: Increase awareness of the availability of healthcare services, financial assistance and insurance coverage options.

Strategy 1- Marketing the existence of healthcare financial and insurance coverage options

Strategy 2- Work with community partners to develop a resource packet for residents

Strategy 3- Make a presentation at several community events

Goal 2: Provide family practice availability within 24hrs for urgent and 21 days for non urgent needs.

Strategy 1- Streamline scheduling using scheduling protocols

Strategy 2- Add 2 providers and evaluate the impact

Strategy 3- Evaluate the possibility of extending the provider schedules

Strategy 4- Work in conjunction with the schools to add mid-levels to the SBHS (yet to be discussed)

Preventive Health

Goal 1: Collaborate with community service organizations to increase the use of mammogram and colonoscopy screenings.

Strategy 1- Participate with LCAC and CHIP to provide needed services in the areas of children's health, obesity/overweight and oral health/dental

Strategy 2- Develop a media campaign to educate the public regarding suggested screening timelines

Strategy 3- Work with community partners to develop themed education months, providing a consistent message throughout the community

Discussion:

Healthy&Fit Kids Camp- This year will be a more curriculum based approach instead of involving community partners.

Teen Health Fair- Focus on mental health this year, it was what the kids wanted.

Eight booths each year and don't be repetitive.

April Beaver will be provider #7 at SWCC, with the main objective to give greater access to care.

Jill Boyd shared with the group information about Patient Centered Primary Care Homes(PCPCH). What these clinics look like throughout the Eastern Oregon Coordinated Care Organization (EOCCO).

- Work with primary care clinics to become PCPCH
- Prevention services- people are not used to being preventative
- Change community perspective

She also talked a little about the LCAC application process. After an LCAC has met the contingencies the release of the first part of the funds usually happens after 30 days. There will be an interim report then another portion will be released. Last will be a review of the final report and the remaining funds will be released. Flow of funds, when community partners need monies. Keep in mind your actual funds may not be available until May.

New Project Ideas, Transformation grant application to be a rolling grant with a maximum of \$50,000 proposal.

Focus Groups (EOCCO CHA)- it was decided to have qualitative focus groups this year. LCAC members and community members consisting of 10-12 people, in an effort to be more collaborative. Will be 90 minute group times and offer incentives.

RCAC Report-

March 27th meeting, guest speaker Dr. Chuck Hoffman. Who is a EOCCO medical adviser and on the clinical advisory board. Public health discussion the hear from all the CAC's on what is going well and what is not. There was a recommendation to have an annual report to EOCCO board. Talk of Public health to be compensated by helping support them with some finding, with them helping with the metrics. What the LCAC funds should be used for incentive measures, transportation, housing, community based projects. We should serve medicaid but also need to reach as many people in our community as possible.
