

## LCAC Meeting Minutes

4/10/2018

Call to order: Jolene at 1 pm

Attendees and introductions: Jolene Cawlfild, Steve Howe, Savanna Cate, Nicki Houck, Val Hebener, James Jordan, Ashley Vanderdasson, Deanna Thrall, Paul McGinnis, Patty Dorroh, Carolyn Bauer, Dan Brown, Dan Grigg, Jennifer Jenks, Tuong Nguyen and Marci McMurphy.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

Dan Grigg: (Gave informational handout) LCAC received \$38,386 in 2016 with which the money was used to hire Nikki Morgan as a coordinator. There was \$13,234.40 left over which was used for adolescent well child care. 2017 money received was \$33,216 (\$29,984 as a grant and \$3322 as rollover).

2018 LCAC will receive \$85,21 for Veggie Rx, \$26,253 for adolescent Well Child Checks, \$8925 for Immunizations and \$15,000 for tobacco cessation.

Hospital plans to give LCAC money for Symmetry Care to them to manage.

Paul stated that he would check with EOCCO (ORPIN) to make sure that the hospital received the full \$5000 for administration fees, that it was not to come out of the garden or Veggie Rx funds.

Steve Howe: He is working to finish details on the data collection necessary for the tobacco cessation program. Trying to figure out how to track utilization of tobacco quit coach hotline. The clinic will be screening for smokers and refer them to the quit line. The grant is focused on cigarette smoking prevalence, but the activities of the grant will benefit all tobacco users.

Steve (reporting to LCAC for CHAT as its advisory committee) The hospital just completed their skin cancer and oral cancer screening in March. Steve would ask Evelyn Neasham to e-mail members a copy of their needs assessment plans. Steve said that they were still working on the resource directory for the website. Paul suggested that Tara Richter with Health Integrated Works for EOCCO may be able to help with resource directory. Steve will be doing another needs assessment in June 2019.

Jolene Cawlfild: The Health Department received the immunization grant. Jolene said that what they had to do was simple, just implement the steps (provided in the last meeting minutes) Virginia Lopez will go out with Jolene to do outreach for WIC. They will put up a new billboard for immunization out by Big Bear on the way to Bend, which will be up for a year. "Love Them, Protect them, Immunize Them." With pictures of a nurse. This billboard will be going up next month.

Ashley Vanderdasson applied for and received the adolescent Well Child Grant. She asked if they could bill for CHW services and was confirmed they can. She will be setting up a meeting with all partners soon to get things going.

Marci McMurphy with Veggie Rx spoke to the LCAC group. She and Paul have met with the data team to create a policy. Veggie RX will be available in June. The next step: she has sent out a Doodle Poll to the council to set up a meeting to review policies and start talking with stores and doing trainings with stores and people on how to give out vouchers. Last year Sherman County implemented their program

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through Gorge Grown (local foods). They had \$22,000 last year. Everyone in the community was screening and they still had money left over. Paul is worried that we may have to limit vouchers to just EOCCO members because we have 1800 EOCCO members in our county and may run out. At the other Veggie RX programs, they are able to have a person at the farmers markets that are able to pay the vendors at the time of service, we won't be able to do that in Harney County. Sherman was worried about HIPAA violations in dealing with GOBHI tracking, however it was decided that it is not a HIPAA violation as long as we were coordinating care.

Jolene was worried that since we are not going to be able to affect health outcomes with the number of vouchers that we will have, if we are going to be held to outcomes for EOCCO? Paul didn't think that they could do that.

To save time/money for people training for the Veggie RX, training will be provided through VYDIO. The health office does not have this program so they will get Virginia set up.

Jennifer Jenks gave a presentation for DD Advisory Committee. Her notes are attached.

Patty Dorroh gave a report on the Regional Community Council meeting. What she noticed is that the CCO's seem to be maturing enough to shift from the incentives to social determinates of health. Harney County has a high need in outlying areas regarding transportation to get food according to the American Community Survey.

Jolene also went to the RCAC and asked members what was or was not working regarding getting member representation at the LCAC meetings. What worked for other LCAC's was to have meeting at lunch time and provide lunch, child care, transportation and stipend.

How do we get more members? Jolene suggested that we have MODA do a mailing to all members for LCAC.

Deanna suggested that maybe there could be a flyer that was handed out to all EOCCO members when they visited the clinic.

Nicki suggested having a booth at the fair with the information.

Jim suggested that something could be put in the newspaper.

Paul spoke about the RCAC meeting. He stated that the LCAC's have been changing focus from the incentive measures to community plans and the RCAC's are allowing the LCAC's to choose.

Jolene: Regarding the incentive measures, public health does a lot of work and should also receive some of the funding not just the primary providers.

Steve Howe: He has talked to the fair director and they are starting to work on "Health Care at the Fair".

Ashley Vanderdasson asked about Arcadia, if there was still a big push to use it.

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Paul: When Ron Wulff reported the clinic numbers vs. Arcadia vs. EOCCO, the numbers didn't match. At this time with a new clinic manager, we are not sure if anyone is actually tracking these numbers. Paul will check on this and report back at the next meeting.

Nicki Houck to give a report on the Laundry vouchers at next meeting.
