Call to Order, Introductions, any changes to the agenda?

Eric Griffith moved to approve the March minutes, Martina Peck seconded. Motion passed.

Public Comment:

- The CBAC lost their transportation van, they need help getting vets to medical appointments out of time. CCNO has a new program working with transporting vets to their appointments, possibly starting in July. The Veteran's programs may have many potential volunteers to help with transportation and driving.
- GRH is working on the Community Health Assessment happening and would like to collaborate. There is a question selection meeting coming, they would like community partners to be involved. if you are interested contact Windy Roberts. It will be on May 14th 9-11.
- NEON has been awarded funds to incorporate opioid misuse and prevention in to their hub. They are hiring a new position to work with CHW to build skills surrounding opioid.

Opioid Infrastructure Partnership – Mike Stensrud:

- They are creating an opioid action team regionally. Death from over dose and Opioid prescriptions have quadrupled since 1999. Union County has the 2nd highest prescribing rate in the state. The prescription drug monitoring program (PDMP), has mandatory enrollment from all prescribers by July 1st this doesn't mean they need to use it, just enroll. The team is looking for members. Liberty Avila, Carrie Brogoitti, Eric Griffith, Jill Boyd, Amanda Grove, Cami Miller and Arlene Franco all volunteered to potentially be a part of the opioid action team.
- CHD has opioid free pain clinics in La Grande and in Baker called Health Solutions.
- CCNO does a chronic pain self-management Living Well class in all of the counties and any one with or who works with chronic pain.
- Naloxone, is a nasal administered overdose response medication. There is 100% city coverage now. Schools is beginning to carry naloxone in their first aid kits. If you have a family member or someone who is using and you are concerned them you can get this from Rite Aid to keep on hand. No training required, there are simple videos on the Oregon Health Authority website. There is a disposal box in Union County at the Police Department and Red Cross is getting one soon.
- The April 28th from 10am to 2pm is the DEA national prescription drug disposal day. There will be sites set up to get rid of all expired and unused medications.

Incentive Metrics Update-Amanda Grove

- The 2017 incentive metrics number are being sent to OHA as our final numbers. We were very close in all of our areas we didn't reach. The EOCCO numbers are meeting 13 of the 17 incentive measures for the year. That means we will be receiving around 11 million dollars back to the CCO. 6% of those dollars come to the LCACs. Our benchmarks are increased about 3% every year. This is only the claims based data.
- The two new incentive measures are mental health emergency department utilization and childhood obesity.
