Old Business: FRONTIER VEGGIE RX UPDATE	
DISCUSSION	<p>Marci reported that she feels that things are going pretty well. We are getting to hear some stories and successes. There have been a few things that were reported such as a family that had to evacuate because of the fire lost their booklets and was worried because they had been told that if they didn't use all of them that they would not receive any more, because GOBHI tracks them. She told them that in fact that was not true and that they only keep track of them so that we can see if someone is not using them we can ask them what the barriers are to spending them. If we can help them with transportation or something else then we would try to do that. Told her since it was the end of the month that she could just go back to her prescriber and get her refill. Had talked with Teddy already and she will not have enough to get through the month, but Farrell is not going to be utilizing the amount that she was allocated, so she will get them to Teddy and they will have to be marked very clearly to know where they came from so that they can be changed to the prescriber. We need to make sure that we are talking to Marci and that we are able to then track how much each prescriber will need. Teddy said that she has had 100% of her clients leaving and saying that they were going to shop right then. Have had people come back the next day or call and tell me how wonderful it was to spend their vouchers. Every person that I have prescribed stated that they want to eat better but could not afford to. Some people come up and give me a hug and thank me so much for the program. It really makes you feel good. Currently have prescribed 41 booklets and have 6-7 more families to catch up to, to get the full intake process done that were assessed already. Teddy is screening the Senior Population at the Senior Meal Sites and at the Food Pantry. Teddy also found some educational tools to use to give to each of the families, and Marci is going to forward on to each of the prescribers to use also. Cindi Brown had talked about doing demonstrations for cooking and we are doing it in Harney County, but Cindi sounded like she has some kind of a relationship with Gilliam County as well, and Paul wondered what that was. Teddy said that it was through the 4 Rivers Early</p>

	<p>Learning HUB and the Parent Education HUB. We are working to get parent education activities out to the whole region, and we are doing “Eat Together Eat Better” Classes through the OSU Extension, and the Snap Ed people are facilitating those classes. We did one in Condon and the Arlington one was planned and cancelled two times already. These are just peripheral activities to go with the Veggie Rx Program and we will let clients know when they are going on here. GOBHI is starting to get coupons back from vendors and we are starting to send out reimbursements to them also. Could look into automatic deposit to the vendors. Marci wanted to let Channel know that her input that she gave at the last meeting was invaluable and wanted her to know that she was not getting anyone into trouble, it was just a miss communication. She was also able to get the booklets that she should have gotten also. She tries to make sure that she is shopping weekly so that she doesn’t have too much waste. It is an important message to tell clients that if we are getting close to the end of the month, to make sure to use up their coupons and just buy something frozen and throw them in the freezer so that they are not wasting them. Paul stated that he was impressed with Grocery outlet in Harney county and that they were not accepting the Veggie Rx vouchers. The reason why was that they were not actually trying to purchase fruits and vegetables with it. The last thing was that whenever the vouchers are prescribed in the month, they could be refilled at the beginning of each of the following months to make it easier.</p>
<p>New Business: IM REPORT</p>	
<p>DISUSSION</p>	<p>The June IM report was looked at. Currently Gilliam County is at a rate of 13.4% with a target of 40.6% in AWC Visits. Currently Gilliam County is at 50% with a target of 79.1% in Childhood Immunizations. Currently Gilliam County is at 29.7% with a target of 46.8% in Colorectal Cancer Screening. Currently Gilliam County is at 7.1% with a target of 22.9% on Dental Sealants. Currently we are at 60% with a target of 65.6% for Developmental Screenings. Currently we are at 18.4% with a target of 49.6% In Effective Contraceptive Usage. Currently we are making the mark on Ambulatory Care and ED Utilization with a rate of 27.20 and a target rate of 51.8. We are also doing well for ED utilization for mental illness with a rate of 65.07 with a target rate of 119.5. And finally we are currently at 9.2% with a target of 15% for Alcohol and Drug Misuse.</p>
<p>New Business: OHA UPDATE</p>	
<p>DISCUSSION</p>	<p>Estella was not able to come this time and hopes to be here the next meeting. Paul stated that item D on the third page is about the State Heath Assessment and that we will need to start having the local health assessment update as a regular agenda item over the winter months to start working on. There are all kinds of things in this like 500 page document. The next version of the CCO 2.0 will come out and we will need to need to align with at least one or maybe two of the state health improvement plan goals and also invest in social determinants of health, which could be the food program that we just got up and running. We are being asked to plan without knowing how are plan is going to be judged by our contracted authority. Estella will talk more about all this.</p>

DISCUSSION	<p>LCAC Support Funds Request needs to be done by the end of September and usually needs two meetings to get this done. Each LCAC will get \$10,000 annually. That is to make sure that there is food at meetings, make sure that there is a meeting space, agendas and minutes and then other things as well as the coordinator funding. EOCCO membership activities, OHA state trainings and travel. Publishing and Office Supplies. The way this works is that it has to be voted upon at the LCAC meeting and recorded in the minutes. We will look at a budget at the next meeting and voted upon.</p> <p>Ideas of things other people are doing. Harney purchased a few AED machines and put them in strategic areas in the community. Sherman County paid the rent for the Food Bank. Lake put some of their dollars towards the summer food programs.</p> <p>MISC ITEMS. Neil Freidrich wanted to know if we have had any Families that were impacted by the recent fires. They can help people with many services. Trying to get a worker out here a little more so that we can help people. They can call, come in or they can come out here also.</p>
