The meeting was called to order by Hayli Sharp at 3:01 PM.

Summary of Actions Taken

- Motion moved by Tom McCoy and seconded by Amber DeGrange to approve November meeting minutes. Motion passed.

Reports & Updates:

- **Approval of Minutes**
 - Minutes for November 1, 2018, were approved.

Thoughts on how Sherman Health Dist. Clinic & LCAC may be supportive of each other to improve the health on the population:

- Christina Rust is the new Physician Assistant Provider at Sherman County Medical Clinic and will be attending Sherman LCAC meetings.
- Some concerns from clients in the past have been hours of availability of medical care in the clinic. A call line after hours has been an option for clients before and continues to be a service

for clients after clinic hours. The call line is an option in 3 clinics at the moment, but hope to have 4 clinics with a call line option soon. GOBHI shared the call line has been working well.

- Sherman County LCAC in the past have worked with Sherman Health Dist. Clinic and done a campaign on colorectal cancer screening and a campaign on adolescent well care visits to help meet the EOCCO Measure metrics. Sherman County LCAC would like to continue working with Sherman Health Dist. Clinic to meet EOCCO Measure metrics, an example being meeting the adolescent well care visits target rate.

Review of 2018 Incentive Measure Progress:

- Amanda Grove reviewed the 2018 Incentive Measure Progress report.

Focus Group Report:

- Jill Boyd reviewed the (CHA) Focus Group Report.
- The EOCCO Community Health Assessment Focus Groups was held on July 5, 2018 at the OSU Extension Building. The focus group session was recorded for accuracy and lasted about one hour and twenty minutes, including time for group discussion and follow-up questions.
- Focus groups are method of data collection focusing on qualitative information regarding attitudes, perceptions and beliefs of the participants. The focus group protocol covered three community health assessment focus areas: (a) community health, (b) health and healthcare disparities, and (c) social determinants of health. Analyses consisted of transcribing the focus group discussion, coding the transcript using qualitative analysis software and analyzing content and key quotes that highlight relevant points for future discussion and action.
- The purpose of the focus group is to drive the Community Health Assessment (CHA) plans for funding in 2019.

LCAC Members recommendations:

- Tom shared that 5 Sherman LCAC members have expiring terms as of December 31, 2018.
- Sherman LCAC members with expiring terms will receive an email and will need to reply if members would like to be re-appointed.

Frontier Veggie Rx Update:

- Haylie received agreement letter for 2019 LCAC funds be used towards the Frontier Veggie Rx program. Motion was passed in the September 6, 2018 meeting for Sherman County LCAC write a letter to EOCCO Board of Directors to reconsider the decision on funds allocated to LCAC. In the November 1, 2018 meeting Paul McGinnis read response letter from EOCCO Board of Directors accepting Sherman County LCAC request for 2019 funds be used towards Frontier Veggie Rx program.
- Marci shared Frontier Veggie Rx Program budget handout. Sherman County is over budget \$5,664. Marci asked GOHBI for an additional \$45,000, if approved an additional 420 booklets for Sherman County would be available until funds start on March 2019.
- Frontier Veggie Rx booklets that expire at the end of December 2018 are the last booklets until funds are available March 2019.
- Marci encouraged Sherman County residents to send letters regarding Frontier Veggie Rx program to PO BOX 2129, The Dalles, OR 97058.

Other Business:

Advantage Dental:

- Ashley with Advantage Dental shared she met with Wes Owens from Sherman County School Dist. and the Sherman County School Dist. is on board with piloting the Tele dentistry at the school.
- As of last month Advantage Dental has a service agreement signed with NORCOR. Ashley will be providing services once a month to juvenile and adult department.
- Ashley will also be providing services at Mid-Columbia Center for Living and plans to meet with Dan Hoffman from Sherman County Mid-Columbia Center for Living.
- Ashley saw 54 kids in Sherman County this year, compared to 138 kids seen last year.
