## Lake County Community Health Improvement Partnership Minutes

**Date and time:** January 11, 2018 – 3:00 p.m.

**Place:** Lake District Hospital, Penn Wilbur conference room

Charlie Tveit, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 3:07 p.m. and asked all members to introduce themselves.

Mr. Tveit presented the December 2017 meeting minutes. CeCe Montgomery made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Jamie Davis seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**Elections:** CeCe Montgomery nominated Charlie Tveit as chair. Jack Thompson moved to close the nominations. The motion was presented and passed unanimously with Charlie Tveit as chair. Paul McGinnis reminded the committee that Arvinder Singh, CHIP Coordinator is the proxy should Charlie not be able to attend.

**Grants:** LCAC Non-competitive grant which involves incentive measures to work with patients to receive certain services, for instance in the past we have focused on colorectal screens and dental sealants. With the incentive funds, if we meet the required measures we can receive additional funds. Namrata Dave reported that there are three measures we are planning to work on are the developmental screens, childhood obesity and prenatal/postpartum screenings. Ms. Dave reported that to encourage families to bring their children in for the developmental screens, will be giving diapers to them at each visit. Susan Campbell noted that a clinical team has been formed to make it easier for the providers with new templates, staff will work with the parents to complete the surveys and to ensure that the providers can do the exams. Mr. Tveit reported that we are working to get certain testing equipment for newborns screening available in more areas of the county. Ms. Dave reported that for the prenatal and postpartum care, we are working with Public Health and there are gift cards available to the patients at each visit. Ms. Dave also reported that we are working on providing counseling on nutrition and physical activity. Jaime Davis made a motion to accept the grant proposals as presented. Dianne Clay seconded the motion. The motion was presented and passed unanimously.

Mr. Tveit discussed how the competitive grants with the CCO are designed. Ms. Dave reported that the colorectal screening grant has up to \$25k available, but that we may need the entire amount. Last years' goal was to have 43.9% participation, and as of November 30, 2017 we were at 39.5% participation and are consistently improving our rates. When the patients participate they receive a gift card incentive. Last year our response was about 50% and Paul McGinnis reported that the expected response rate is about 30%. Mr. McGinnis reported that if the participants don't want the funds, that in other areas they are donating the funds to the schools. Will Cahill will look into donations and how that can work. Ms. Dave reported that we will be holding a Senior Fair and presenting the info at the Daly Days Health Fair.

Mr. Tveit reported that we will also be looking at increasing adolescent well care visits and promoting another teen

health fair in Lakeview and another in North Lake. There was discussion on increasing visits with the 18-21 age range as well and Ms. Dave reported that we will be reaching out Klamath Community College to work on this.

Mr. Tveit reported that as a new measure we will also be reaching out on diabetes and hypertension. Mr. Tveit reported that we are working on support classes, books, and training clinic staff to run and support the groups. There was discussion on healthy eating and VeggieRx program in Gilliam, Sherman and Harney counties. Jack Thompson made a motion to endorse the competitive grant applications. Will Cahill seconded the motion. The motion was presented and passed unanimously.

**Measure 101:** Mr. McGinnis reported that ballots on Measure 101 were mailed last week and discussed what Measure 101 entailed. Mr. Tveit noted that the District can't take a stance, but the Board of Directors did endorse the measure. There were questions and discussion.

**EOHLA update:** Alanna Chamulak reported that Adult Mental Health First Aid classes will be held the 17<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> with law enforcement and February 12 and 13 for older adult modules with the target individuals attending from the ministerial association. Ms. Chamulak reported that they are working on bringing the training to the schools in the fall.

**FoodCorps:** Brooke Kelleher reported that she is training with the schools with the Smarter Lunch Program to implement changes in the cafeteria and help students make smarter choices.

Janine Simms reported that she and Francie Winters have started the second chronic pain series in the afternoon at the senior center. There were questions and discussion.

Jack Thompson reported that the Youth Mentor Program Dinner will be held February 24<sup>th</sup> at the Elks.

Jaime Davis reported that the Triathlon Training for children is starting at the OHSU Extension office; with the goal that kids to learn ways to be more active in the summer and to participate in the Home Health & Hospice Triathlon in August.

Nonie Moss reported that the senior center is facilitating a lot of classes, etc. such as the Living Well program and currently the Strong People program is outgrowing the dining room area of the senior center. Ms. Moss reported that transportation is being used a lot and that while anyone can request a ride, the priority is for seniors, disabled and veterans.

Mr. Tveit adjourned the meeting at 4:20 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for February 8, 2018, at 3 p.m. at Lake District Hospital Penn Wilber Conference Room.
