Updates:

Grant CAC funds – We have received the first installment of funds totaling \$15,153.50 .We will be distributing funds requested: \$3,000 to Family Fun Day, \$4,500 to Motivational Interviewing, \$2,200 to Poverty Training and the remaining \$5,453.50 to the Task Force.

Grant County CAC Paid out \$30,749 in funds for 2017. We currently have around \$8,800 for operational funds, our monthly expenses as a CAC are around \$600.

LCAC Community Benefit Initiative Reinvestments Application

* *Community Health Worker/SWCC* – Currently have two employees training and working half time at their regular jobs. They will be helping implement followups for multiple ED visits by a patient, better service to help meet metrics, help provide quality wrap around healthcare and help train the medical assistants.

Discussion on having the at least on of the healthcare workers come to the monthly CAC meetings after the graduate from training in June. Collaboration with Kimberly at CCS for better wrap around care

* *Community Task Force/Trauma Trainings* –Had a great turn out for trauma training on May 10th and 11th Had around 25 parent turn out for parent night on the 10th and there were 90 providers on professional day on the 11th . Had diverse group of around 25 attendees at the Darkness to Light event. Many parents stayed after the event to talk with speaker and ask questions.

There will be a follow up training in October 19th for trauma-informed care with teachers, including 5 school districts. Kevin Hines has committed to be at Grant Union October 18th to talk with students and will hold a community night that same evening.

**Motivational Interviewing/June 20, 2018* – Class is full. They have many entities signed up, DHS, Police and Clergy just to name a few. Update at next meeting. Discussion about trauma-informed care

for the workers at the county jail. Discussed having CAC present to the Law Enforcement Safety Committee(meet quarterly) some opportunities for trainings being offered that may benefit them.
* *Family Fun Day/June* - 11th Annual, have 14 booths so far looking to have 17. Always in need of volunteers. Email Teresa if you are interested in having a booth, it must include a kid activity.

Grant County Health Fair /June 15, 2018 – Will have two Tai Chi classes, Stroll en Colon, sleep hygiene, CDC brochures for free. There are 40 plus scholarships available for blood work. Recruitment for new LCAC members at the table, with pamphlets we already have made up.

Catch The Wellness Wave- DHS helped put on a 3-6th grade health fair for 271 kids on May 9th. With booths and activities from Advantage Dental, Bike Safety, Mental Health Peer Pressure, Aroma Therapy(OSU Extension). Six stations in total including a sugar content station. This event is being featured in the Oregon Health Authority News

Advantage Dental – Kim Mecham, with regional outreach clinic said she is booking up fast for clinics so need to contact asap to book a date. They have received funding for Teledentistry in Gilliam and Wheeler County. Teledentistry is a combination of telecommunications and dentistry involving the exchange of clinical information and images over remote distances for dental consultation and treatment planning.

Health Department Accreditation – Survey on public health. Will have a power point on public health and what communities expect of them and what services they provide.

**Teen Health Fair* – Was held May 1st, Senior Elija Humbird used this years teen health fair as his senior project. He did a pre fair survey on what the teens wanted at their health fair this year, which change the fair from years past. Booths included Stress-ball, CPR, Mental Health, Addiction, Facilitated Questions and Trauma. Conducted a post survey to collect feedback.

Focus Groups (EOCCO Community Health Assessment) – June 4th from 12-1:30pm at the John Day Fire Hall will have a Focus Group to collect qualitative data to add to the quantitative data.

This quarters Regional CAC meeting will be held at the Grant County Airport, June 26th from 10am-3pm. We discussed as a local CAC to sponsor the meeting.
