### ***Incentive Measure Progress Report (August)***

Linda will email out the report for Grant County that is up to date through July 2018.

Grant County met the measure for Developmental Screenings!

We need to find out more info about how Colorectal numbers are measured.

1. Does fecal screening need to be done every year?
2. If you get a colonoscopy does your number fall off the metric until you are do for another or does it stay?

There were 122 dental sealants done in September, only need 38 more to meet metric.

Linda will reach out to Courtney Whidden, from MODA, about data pool and numbers, look at reporting period dates when reviewing the numbers. We will have more incentive measure discussion at a future meeting.

### ***LCAC Community Benefit Initiative Reinvestments (CBIR)***

No Application as of today, it is supposed to come out some time in October. Linda will email it out when she receives it.

**Grant County 2019 funds** - \$37,120 - 60-70% available for CHP, 30-40% required to invest in incentive measure improvement. (final numbers to be determined)

Need to have a discussion/work session on how to use 2019 funds. Late November work session? (Due the end of January)

### **Group discussion and direction of Request for Proposal (RFP)**

\*Need to get numbers from SWCC on CAC investment from 2018

\*Thad Labhart shared that he had been in discussion with the Long Creek School Principal regarding a pilot year with a school counselor, similar to what was done at Prarie City in 2017. Maybe LCAC funds could help this happen at least on day a week. *Discussion: make sure it helps meet metrics, possibly include Monument School to have more numbers, 14,000 in kind from CCS.*

### **RCAC Meeting Update** – joint meeting with early learning leaders.

Patti reported a very well attended meeting, standing room only. About half in attendance were from Early Learning. They split into groups and had discussion on the key community detriments. A common theme in most counties included Poverty, Isolation (geographic and personal), Uptake on drug use.

Kathy reported that Grant County LCAC has empowered Grant County greatly. In the discussion group it was agreed that more parent outreach is needed. We need more Triple P online classes, program actives after the initial class is attended. Grant County has a problem with retaining qualified staff after they are hired whether it be due to lack of housing or to a better job out of county. This was the 5<sup>th</sup> year the annual joint meeting was held between LCAC and Early Learning Leaders. The meeting was held at EOTEC in Hermiston.

### ***Child Care Resource and Referral***

Meagan Bransma: CCR&R provides training and support for child care providers. Child Care Provider licensing and continuing education are supported. Encourage all providers to be licensed. There is a need to find help covering out-of-pocket expenses for providers. They are a NON-regulatory agency that help providers meet rules and regulations. She explained that it is not a good idea for a provider to watch more than three children other than your own without being licensed or you can be fined by the state. Programs to meet standards and get funds depending on star rating system. Grant County currently has two group care facilities and four total licensed providers. They are located in the L building next to the health department. 541-575-1112.

### ***CCO 2.0***

Estella Gomez reported that CCO 2.0 will start in January 2020. There were 43 policy recommendations passed. Everyone will have access to health care, behavioral health for adolescents. GOBHI is looking into ways to support Nurse Family Partnership and partnering with public health.
