DISCUSSION	Identified Gaps & Recommended Preventive Health Care Practices
<p>Maggie: Affordable housing is a barrier. Those that have a record can't apply for low-income. OHP transportation can only do transportation from A to B. They can't pick up the parents and then children from school and then the appointment. Darrin: The brokerage is contacting them to do non-emergency transportation. Catie: The brokerage is more likely to accommodate the hospitals request than the clients. We could talk to Dan S. about that. This could be something the transportation subcommittee could help with as well. Mariah: Housing is something that keeps coming up but the low income was not part of the debate. It might be worth while to talk to the city council to really emphasize that we are struggling with low income, they might not know what low-income is. Darrin: Pendleton is talking about adding low income at 1000/month but that is not affordable for low income families. Bart: Attended a workshop and part of it had to do with treatment activities but a lot had to do on how you work towards getting housing. They made a point that we need to be working with local authorities to try to educate them and have them be part of the solution and also adding business people. We really need more people to participate in the housing committee. If you are interested and want to meet after this meeting they are really looking for more representation. Housing is a priority for GOBHI and they only have one person working on this and many other things. Maybe they could look at hiring one person to specifically work on this that has experience. Catie: We could start think of 2019 funding opportunities such as housing. Maggi: We could have a project where we have trailers that people no longer use and have our families living in those instead of in cars, they could pay like \$50 and work with the community to give back. This would only be temporarily housing. Bart: There is a place that is similar to that in Portland. They are thinking of doing projects like tiny houses. Catie: Expunges are costly but doable for the clients. That is also something that we could talk about LCAC funds in the future. Union LCAC are also funding rides out of the brokerage. Troy: We could submit a grant for the new ideas and it does not have a deadline. Darrin: They are working on a project with UCo health to place the charging station in the transportation vans.</p>	
DISUCSSION	A look at Incentives

Metric Report Card

CCO met 13 out of 17 metrics. Troy: Umatilla was instrumental to the CCO being able to meet theirs. For the CCO we did not meet the colorectal cancer screening and the ED utilization. For Umatilla county we did not meet the ED utilization and developmental screens. Catie: there are ways of improving this. We know we did the 113 that were needed. It was due to the fact that they were not reviewed by the provider within 30 days. Jessica: We do them in our program, if we know they have an appointment coming up can we get it in their hands and have them take it to their appointment. For the organizations that do them it would be great if they could assist clients in scheduling appointments. Amy: Providers are not doing ASQ's. Catie: It's the community that is doing them and relying on the provider to claim them. Maggi: Can they do it while they are in the waiting room. Sometimes parents don't comprehend what they are asking so they over score or under score. Catie: When she was in Portland they would have the things there and the parents could do the ASQ's at the provider's office.

Community Benefit Funds

There are 6,000 left over LCAC funds that we could use for ASQ's. We could use this funding for possibly getting kits and getting the electronic version for ASQ's. Erin: Would it affect future funding project for 3 counties if we do a pilot in Umatilla County. Troy: We could have this conversation with Ann K. Cathy: If GSMG is doing something with ASQ's why not add to it instead of having a new project. Troy: We should look at all of the possibilities and we could let them help us. Mariah: Would like funds for the CO monitors. The cost would be about \$900. Bart: do we have to vote today. It would be nice to have something on a piece of paper. If we are going to vote on it we need to have something written. Cathy: I agree, we need to have something written to decide. Jim: If we are parking it as discretion funds that is fine. If we need a few thousand to push something over we need to do it. Catie: The ASQ would not use all 6,000. Catie: We need a vote to move the budget forward. 16 vote to move forward with the budget with fruits and veggies, the coordinator, and 6000 as discretionary.

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EOHLA Update
 Healthy, Happy Smiles: Program implementation is almost complete for the 2017-18 school year.

Mental Health First Aid: 17 of 30 trainings have been conducted in eastern Oregon. The next training is scheduled for 5/3/18, Public Safety module in Enterprise. To schedule a training, please contact John Adams.

Colon Cancer Screenings: Project outreach activities will begin in April, including an outreach table with Nolan the Colon at the Columbia River Health Pharmacy grand opening event on Saturday, April 7th.

Obesity/Social Marketing: EOHLA aims to prevent an increase in the rate of obese individuals by increasing fruit and vegetable consumption of Latino moms in counties with high Latino populations, including Morrow, Umatilla, and Malheur. EOHLA will partner with OSU Extension to provide Food Hero programming in project counties. First, IOHLA will conduct a social marketing campaign and provide focus groups with the target population, to identify effective messages, materials, and programs. EOHLA is developing the focus group project and proposal.
