Minutes Reviewed- Motion to approve was made by Jessica Winegar, Seconded by Mary Ann Wren. All were in favor, minutes approved.

Updates:

Family Fun Day- Held June 16th, this was the 11th annual fun day. They had 143 kids that played on the inflatables, 67 kids swam in Gleason Pool and 32 bike helmets were distributed. They served 135 hot dogs and 240 hamburgers. There were 15 interactive booths, numerous event sponsors, several in-kind donors and many volunteers and staff that helped make it happen.

Community Task Force/Trauma Training's –Had a great turn out for trauma training on May 10th and 11th. Had around 25 parents turn out for parent night on the 10th and there were 90 providers on professional day on the 11th. Had diverse group of around 25 attendees at the Darkness to Light event. Many parents stayed after the event to talk with speaker and ask questions.

There will be a follow up training in October 19th for trauma-informed care with teachers, including 5 school districts. Kevin Hines has committed to be at Grant Union October 18th to talk with students and will hold a community night that same evening.

Motivational Interviewing- The training was a full day at the Grant County Regional Airport. There was an eclectic, diverse group of 37 people the worked well together for the day. Chris is planning on doing more training's in the future. There was a pre and post survey that he would like to revamp before the next training.

Focus Groups(EOCCO Community Health Assessment)

Key Take-A-WAY- We, as a CAC, need to expand our membership search beyond the John Day area. We need to try and get members from other parts of the county.

Debi mentioned maybe doing a type of Grant County Road Show. Where different agencies would go present and answer questions in all the towns around the county, help keep everyone informed.

Cost and Utilization Data/County Progress Report- (For More DATA see attachment GRANT DASHBOARD)

- Community Health Workers will need to bill for more hours, the money is there. Working more hours will hopefully help meet more metrics.
- Rural Clinics are eligible for wrap around payments
- Grant County- 18measures, need better tracking on mental health diagnosis and ED use.

We will need to have more tools to help us meet more metrics- Data Dictionary, Coding Dictionary, Incentive Measures. The less inpatient spending and more professional spending = less in hospital care.

Grant County Health Fair Report/ June 15, 2018-

The LCAC had a table to promote colorectal cancer screenings, with the strollin colon. They had 4 drawings for \$25 in Grant County Greenbacks. All you had to do was schedule a screening appointment. They had 9 people schedule a screening. 90% of people asked knew the recommendations for colorectal screenings but still didn't do it. Janell Moulton also shared her story throughout the day.

Linda purchased the \$100 in Greenbacks and asked to be reimbursed.

Motion to reimburse Linda was made by Jessica Wingar, seconded by Chris Yriarte. Motion Passed.

Nurse Practitioner, Nora Healy, held a Tai Chi demonstration with Kyle Cline, Tia Chi Instructor, and volunteer instructors who participate in the weekly gatherings. CCS had a booth which Chris Olwine participated. Community Trauma Team representatives which included Tracey Blood, Katrina Randless and Lisa Weigum, manned a booth where 65 ACES Assessments were collected.

The purpose of this outreach was to bring more community awareness to Grant County residents about the effects of trauma in individuals lives. Drawings at this booth included a load of gravel donated by Tidewater and gift baskets from the local hardware stores.

EOHLA Update- Happy Healthy Smiles includes 4 EOCCO counties, they are working on getting more consent form back so they can treat more students. Trying to get the forms in registration packets at the high schools. Screening dates have all been scheduled, Grant Union is October 22nd-24th, Seneca is September 27th and Humbolt is September 8th – 10th.
