## ***Substance Abuse:***

Goal: Increase awareness of substance abuse and the potential for abuse by educating the community

Strategy 1: **Data gathering** related to substance abuse within Grant County

Strategy 2: Provide **K-12 education** on potential for abuse impact: Substance abuse (illegal and/or legal) statistics will decline

Goal: Provide options for alternative pain management to community members

Strategy 1: Provide **community education** regarding current options available

Strategy 2: Identify **additional alternatives** that could be developed or expanded

## ***IN THE MEDICAL SYSTEM:***

Goal: Educate employees and the public regarding BMHD's commitment to confidentiality to improve trust and confidentiality

Strategy 1: Develop a community-wide **public relations campaign** for positive messaging

Strategy 2: Develop an **employee engagement** project

Strategy 3: Broaden **HIPPA Training** to include board members, providers, employees, volunteers, contractors and vendors

Anticipated impact: Employees and community members will report an increase in their trust of the medical system through follow-up surveys

Goal: Promote providers and services to build trust within the community

Strategy 1: Develop a **marketing campaign** to promote BMHD providers and services

Anticipated impact: Employees and community members will report an increase in their trust of the medical system through follow-up surveys

## ***Summary of Results // Next Steps***

A little over **half-way through** the process (ends 2019)

**Raised \$20,000** for trauma-informed care support / substance abuse prevention (City of John Day & Grant County Marijuana Tax Receipts)

**May & October Campaigns** for Substance Abuse Awareness/Trauma Informed Care

Objective **sounding board** for BHMD staff on multiple issues

**Ideation** around brand management // services for BMHD (improvements)

**Re-survey** the hospital staff (before and after)

Discussion:

Do crossover work with other initiatives(CHNA)

\*Distribute funding rather than start anew

\*Pool resources

\*Rod shared that sometimes you get a better return on a survey when you include a \$2 bill

Perspective- Take all three CHAW's and pool them. Hospital, Health Department and EOCCO add focus on more than on CHA.

CHA- Focus groups, will need a list of 25. Health Dept. will share their list. Kathy will send out an email so that the CAC can make their own list.

How can we better meet metric-

Screening need to get well child care visit within 30 days

Have a provider at screenings

Follow up phone call (SWCC Community Health Care Worker)

Have colorectal talk at the senior center about options for screenings

Grant County CAC has been approved funds of \$33,674 with contingencies

All entities that applied for funds will need to provide real numbers not percentages.

\*Developmental Screenings- change from 5% to increase number of screening by 10 children

\*Emergency Department reduce numbers by 15 visits

**FROM 5-7PM THERE IS USUALLY A SURGE IN URGENT CARE**

The Community Healthcare Worker(CHW) will keep track of ED visits

\*Family Fun Day- need actual number attending not a percentages

\*Poverty Training- Base line is 0 Teresa will get Linda an actual number they plan to reach

\* Trauma Informed Care- hoping to reach 0-60

Trauma Informed Care needs advanced funds of \$750 for their pinwheels for Child Abuse Prevention Month, which is all of April. Motion to advance funds by Jessica seconded by Chris, all in favor.

EOHLA has 3 Mental Health First Aid Trainings scheduled so far, contact Lisa
