Review and Complete Updates for EOCCO/LCAC Community Benefit Initiative Reinvestment Program Agreement

- Funds Distribution of first installment of CBIR money (\$16,704)
 - Families First - \$4,000 reimbursement for Lactation Consultant Training
 - Strawberry Wilderness Community Clinic - \$5,000 for equipment and IT
 - Community Counseling Solutions - \$7,704 Long Creek/Monument Counselor

Motion to approve CBIR fund disbursement – Chris Labhart
Seconded by Sam Palmer, all in favor, motion passed

Progress Report due July 15th. Second disbursement scheduled upon review of first progress report.

Members would like to draft a letter to EOCCO CBIR financial administrators to address payment schedule and timeliness of disbursements. Linda will collect emails from members and community partners.

The EOCCO met the CHAPS measure. We were one of only four CCOs to accomplish this success. We met 14 of the 17 metrics, which means we will receive 100% of available funding in 2020.
