Members were asked to give an organizational report and identify any gaps or need for partnerships or resources.

DHS – Heidi

Received information that state is facing \$2.75 billion shortfall in revenue. DHS will need to make cuts near 325 million dollars. Additional SNAP benefits have been approved for those individuals who previously qualified and will be retroactive.

Education – Erin and Marie

What does school look like next fall? Schools will resume in Phase III of state reopening. MCSD is working on plan consisting of three very different scenarios.

1. All operations are normal and school will resume as it has historically
2. Hybrid operation where alternating schedules, PPE or accommodations are implemented
3. Distance learning for all continues

Good Shepherd Health Care System – Jessica

Some additional services are available on a limited basis (elective procedures and pharmacy). Community education continues with many virtual courses. Courses are record and posted to web for community access. Topics: stress management, Medicare 101, fall prevention, exercise and nutrition, Living Well, tools for caregivers and matter of balance.

Domestic Violence Services – Kathryn

Continued assistance to coordinate and provide services. Some groups have been moved to “on-line” sessions. Currently providing crisis line volunteer training.

GOBHI – Troy

Currently addressing CCO 2.0 requirements, which includes LCAC Selection Committee.

Morrow Veteran's Services – Linda

Providing services virtually as much as possible. MoCo Resource Connect intermission until June or July. Additional referrals provided to mental service and Veteran's Administration. Veteran's Services donated masks to the Neighborhood Center of South Morrow County.
